

Below are the differences in applying to Cal State University vs University of California schools.

Minimum GPA

2 years of History/Social Science, including 1 year of U.S. History or U.S. History and Government and 1 year of an additional approved Social Science

4 years of college preparatory English Courses

3 years of Mathematics, 4 years recommended, including Algebra I, Geometry and intermediate algebra or higher mathematics

2 years of Laboratory Science. including 1 year of Biological Science and 1 year of physical Science with Lab

1 year-long course of Visual and Performing Arts

2 years of the same language other that English

CSU uses an eligibility index to determine if a student will be accepted

1 year of approved college preparatory Elective\

Minimum GPA

2 years of History/Social Science, including 1 year of World History and 1 year of U.S. History and Government or $\frac{1}{2}$ year of U.S. History and $\frac{1}{2}$ year of Civics or Government

4 years of college preparatory English Courses

3 years of college preparatory Mathematics, 4 years recommended, that include advanced algebra geometry

2 years of Laboratory Science, 3 years recommended, including 1 year of a Biological Science and 1 or 2 years of a Physical Science

1 year-long course of Visual and Performing Arts

2 years of the same language other that English

UC asks students to write Personal Insight statements, and takes other extracurricular activities into consideration

> 1 year of approved college preparatory Elective



Below are the differences in Cal State University vs University of California systems.

Neither the UC nor the CSU system is better than the other - rather, students may be better suited to a certain system due to their academic and/or career goals.

COURSES	
Their courses are based on practical applications and non-research-oriented careers.	Their courses are based on research and theories.
DEGREES	
CSU system awards mostly bachelor's degrees and does not offer as many advanced-level degrees.	In addition to bachelor's and master's degrees, UC also awards professional and doctorate degrees.
"A-G" COURSES	
	UC require students to complete the "a-g" courses with a grade of a C or better
TUITION as of 2022-2023	
CSU's tuition rate: \$5,742 per academic year With addition fees of living & school supplies: \$24,000 (on-campus), \$28,000 (off-campus) Non-California residents are charged: \$396 per semester	UC's tuition rate: \$13,200 per academic year With addition fees of living & school supplies: \$38,500 (on-campus), \$35,600 (off-campus) Non-California residents are charged: \$31,026 in supplemental tuition



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
